- **CP - Trains of Portugal**

“The first train journey in Portugal, between Lisbon and Carregado, took place on October 28, 1856. At that time there were no roads, not even good roads. Since then, the evolution of the railway in Portugal, a great human adventure, has changed and marked the development of the country. With about 126 million passengers transported per year (in 2018), CP is one of the most representative Portuguese companies and the largest land transport company operating in Portugal. ”

“Carris - Lisbon Railroad Company - is the company responsible for buses, trams and elevators in Lisbon. It was founded in 1872, has 2321 employees, of which 1633 are Crew members (Drivers and Brake Guard) who manage a fleet of 608 buses, 48 trams, 3 lifts and 1 elevator. ”
